Disparate Impact of Government Housing Policy on Minority Home Ownership Opportunities

Presented by the ABA Forum on Affordable Housing and Community Development Law

This program will focus on a particular crisis within affordable housing development that disproportionately affects minority families. The median net worth of people of color in the United States is approximately 15% of that of whites and this gap is even larger for low-to-moderate income communities. In American society, owning a home, and establishing some equity in that home is one of the most important components of the average family's wealth portfolio. Home ownership rates of people of color are significantly lower than that of whites, while the percentage of people of color with subprime loans, and those who are or have been subject to foreclosure on home loans is significantly higher. Despite major policy considerations in the past several years to increase opportunities for low income and minority home ownership, the desired results have not been achieved. In addition, in many states facing severe economic hardship, the level and frequency of foreclosures has had a disproportionate impact on low income and minority residents. This program will discuss the trade-offs of offering families limited equity in affordable housing projects, so as to increase the number of families who can benefit from the programs.

The panel will also discuss opportunities for careers in affordable housing and community development law in the public and private sectors as a niche practice area. Panelists will bring experience from the nonprofit, government and private sectors, and from geographically diverse communities.

Race and the Roberts Court

The U.S. Supreme Court will soon be deciding whether a local school district may use race as a factor in assigning students to schools in a public school district. The fundamental issue is whether the Equal Protection Clause bars such consideration of race, even when part of a program designed to promote diversity in public schools. A recent *New York Times* article observed that there “seemed little prospect that either the Louisville, KY, or Seattle plans would survive the hostile scrutiny of the court’s new majority.”

With these cases as a starting point, we will discuss the issues of race that are likely to face the Roberts court in the coming years. How might the coming decisions of the Roberts shape the future course of affirmative action, integration and equality in America?
