Documents sealed by order of the Court will be handled in accordance with California Rule of Court 243 *et seq.*

No envelope containing confidential or sealed material may be opened by anyone except a judge or appropriate court personnel. Confidential material may be provided to the defendant’s attorney of record if he or she has the written consent of the defendant, or a court order.

Violation of this court order may constitute contempt of court for violation of a lawful court order and will be punished accordingly.

This order is effective as of September 1, 2004.
