Description of Program

This is a unique year-long program that fosters mutual mentoring and learning relationships. Mentors and mentees will be paired and given program guidelines and other materials to help facilitate effective mentorship and learning. Mentees will learn from experienced judicial officers about items such as the judicial appointments and elections processes, life as a judicial officer, resume building, leadership development, interviewing and networking tips, and other career development advice.

- Be an attorney in at least your 3rd year of practice
- Have considered becoming a judge sometime in your practice
- Commit to contact, interact, or meet with mentor at least quarterly

- Application packets must be received by Friday, June 12, 2020 at 5:00 p.m.
